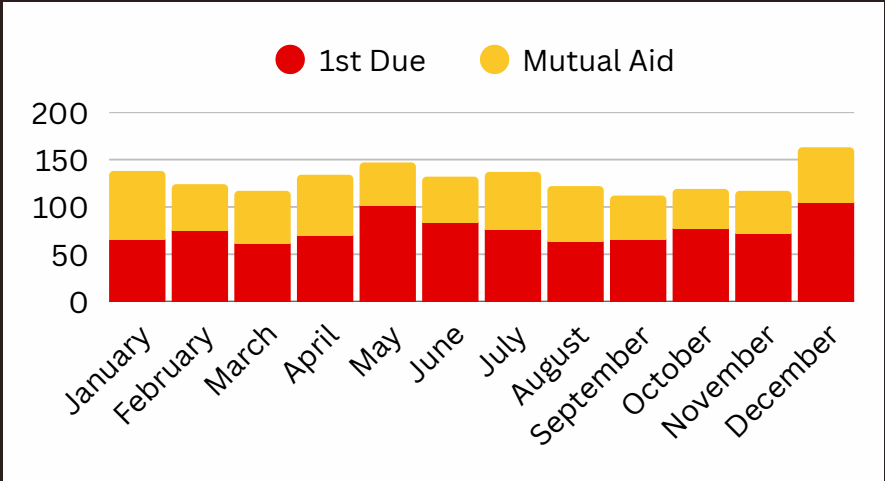

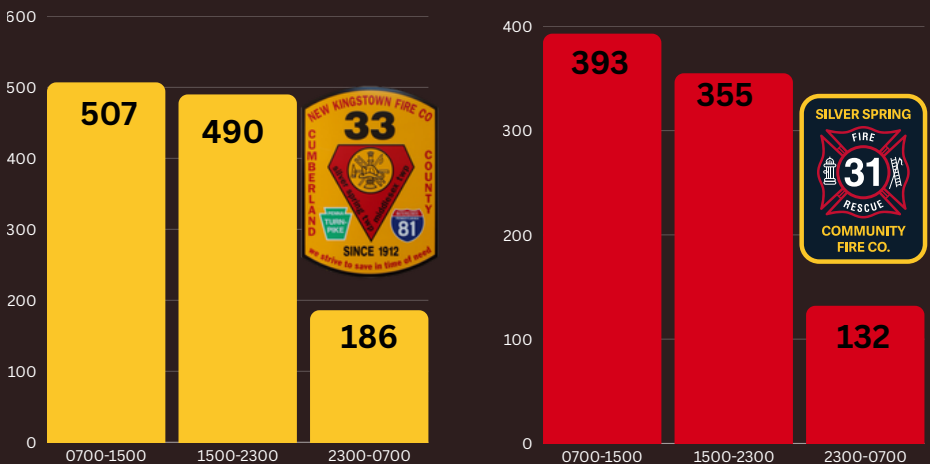

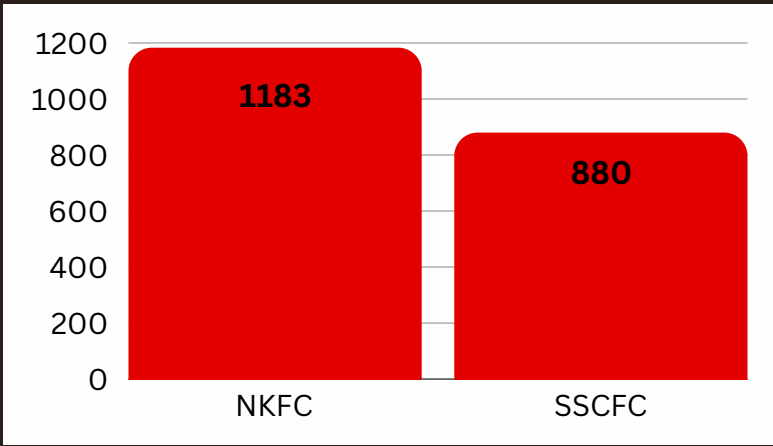

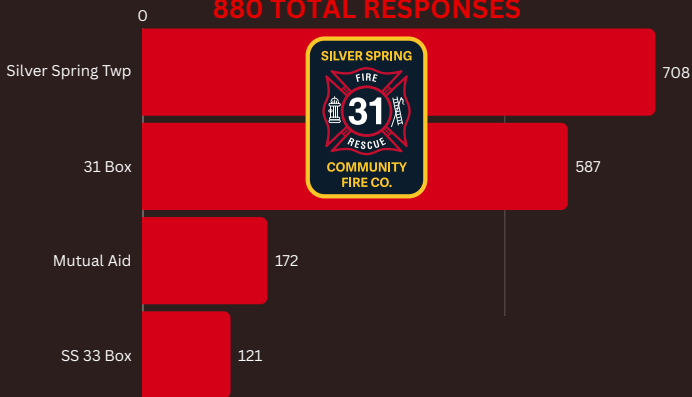
CALLS BY HOUR COMPANY



Total Responses Per Station

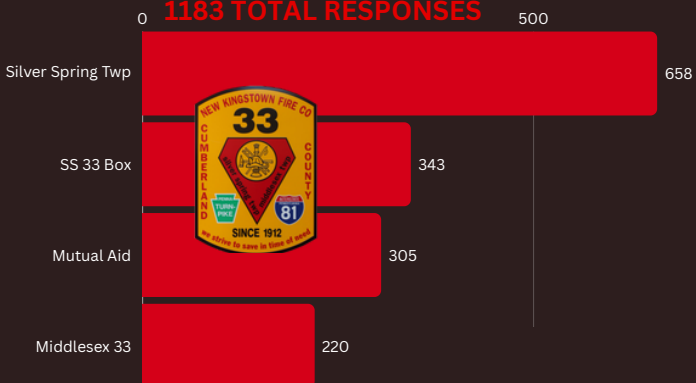


SILVER SPRING COMMUNITY 880 TOTAL RESPONSES



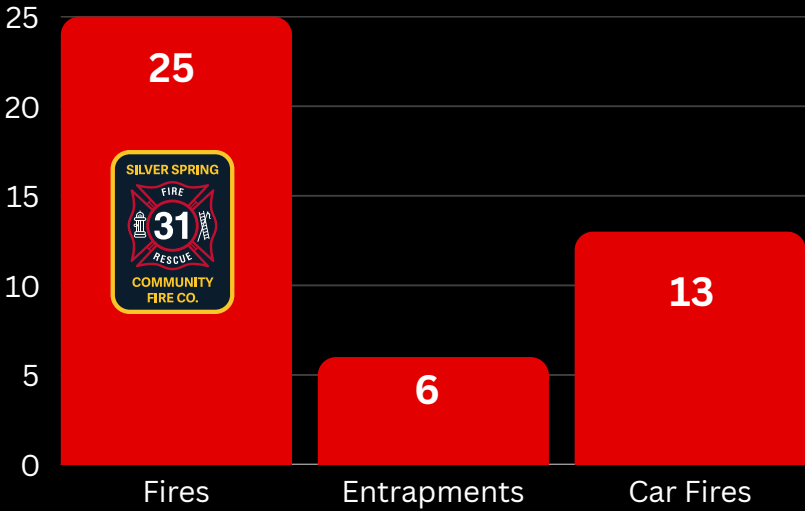

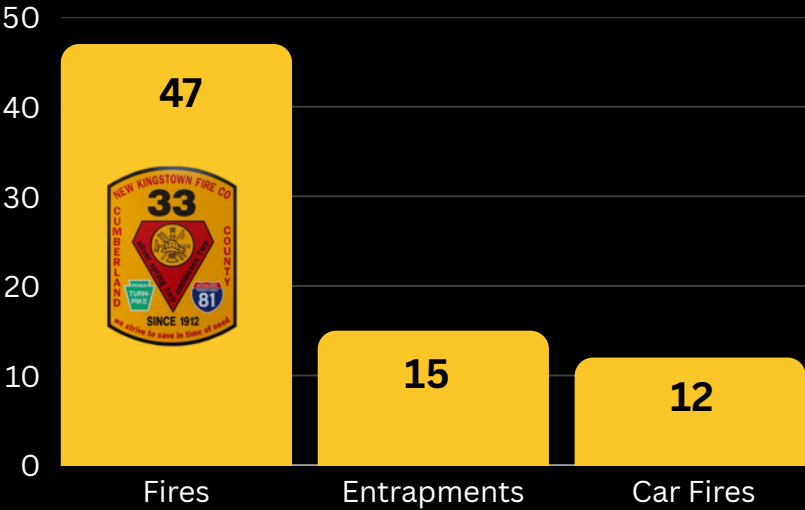


2025 WORKING INCIDENTS

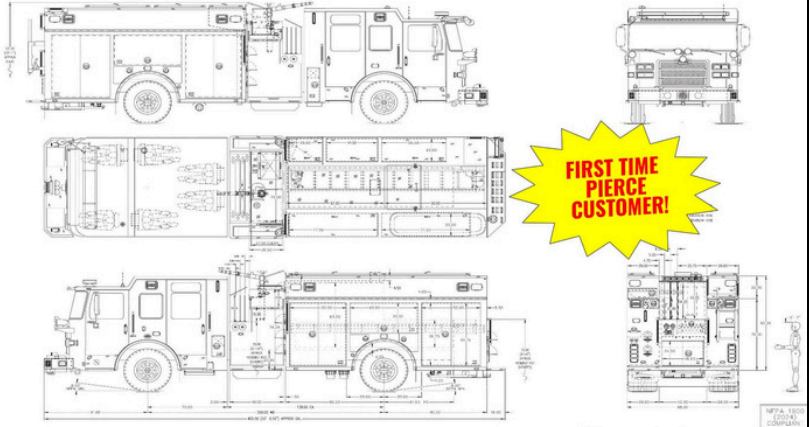

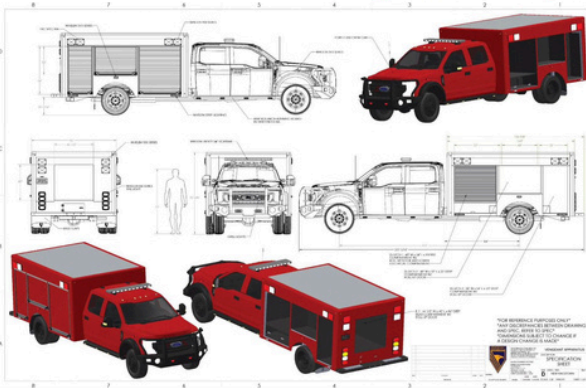

Maintained crew on station 1,082 times in 2025 while first due crew was on a response.

Added 7 Part-Time staff to assist with filling voids during limited volunteer availability

Focused heavily on retention of current active membership and began building a team approach to decision making.
